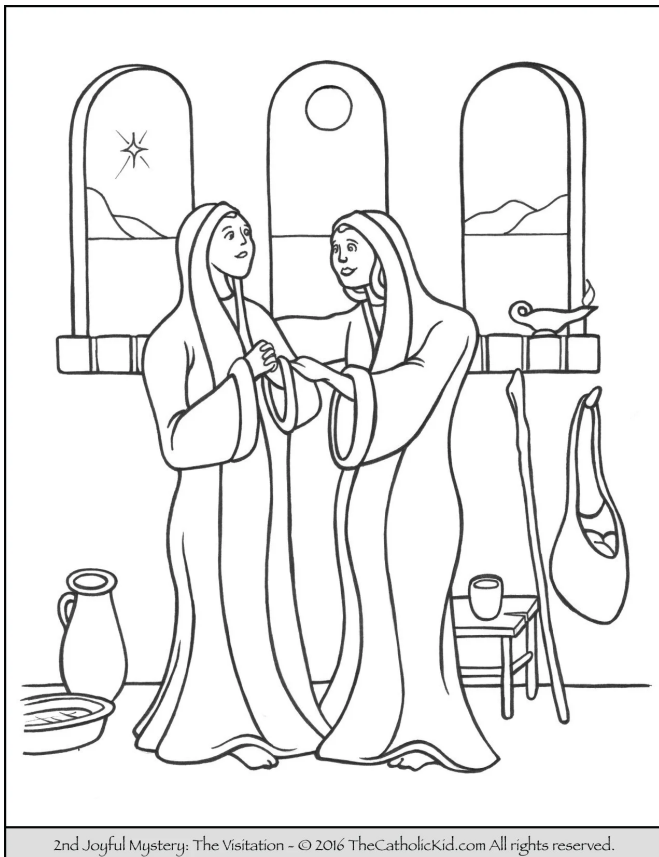




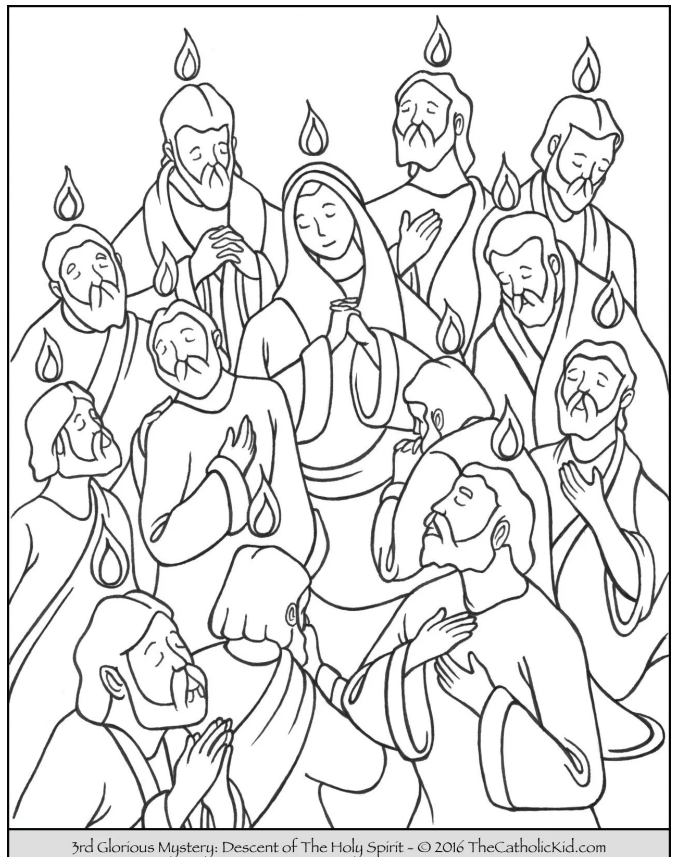

**LITTLE ONES:** The Visitation commemorates Mary as the first evangelist - bringing Jesus to others. John the Baptist leapt with joy in his mother's womb at being in the presence of Jesus. Does Jesus make you leap for joy? How can you share that joy with others?

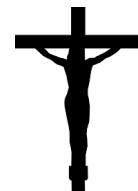
**BIGGER ONES:** It takes courage to share the Faith with others as the apostles did after Pentecost. **Saint Joan of Arc** lived in France during the early 1400s. As a young girl, Joan had a vision of St. Michael the Archangel, and he told her she was to lead a battle against the English. She continued to have visions and when she was 16, she went to work fulfilling the role God intended for her. She became a successful military leader and defeated the English during many battles even though she was young and even though, at the time, women didn't go into battle. Eventually, she was captured by the English and put to death at the age of 19. As she died, she asked to be given a cross to hold and look at, and she called on the name of Jesus as she died. She teaches us that the Lord will give us all the courage and special graces we need to accomplish whatever He asks of us. She is the patroness of France, prisoners, soldiers, and people who are persecuted for faith. We celebrate the feast of Saint Joan of Arc on May 30. **Saint Joan of Arc, pray for us!**
