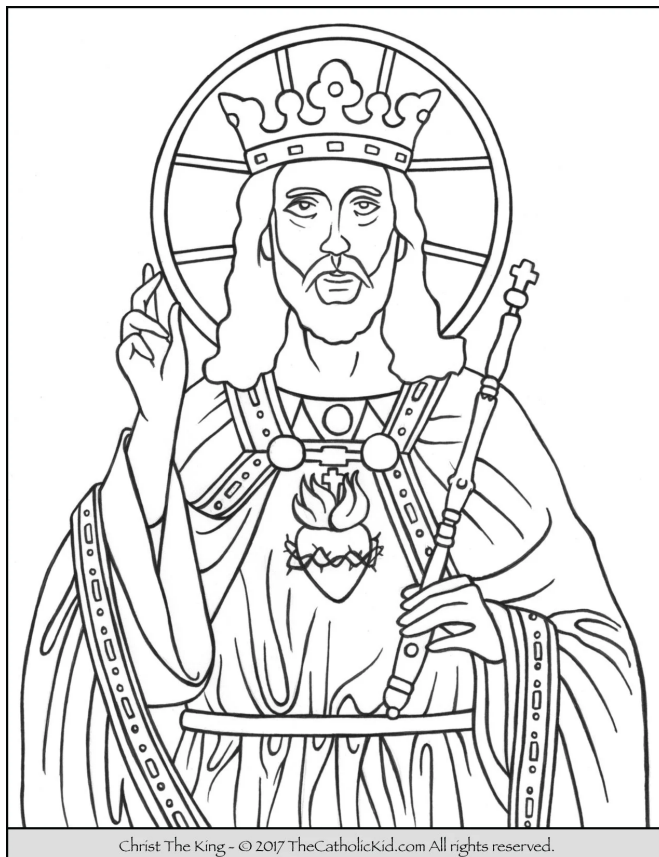
Gospel: Matthew 25: 31-46

In this week's Gospel, Jesus teaches that when the Son of Man comes in glory, he will judge the nations, separating the sheep from the goats.

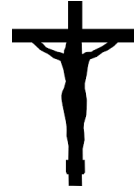

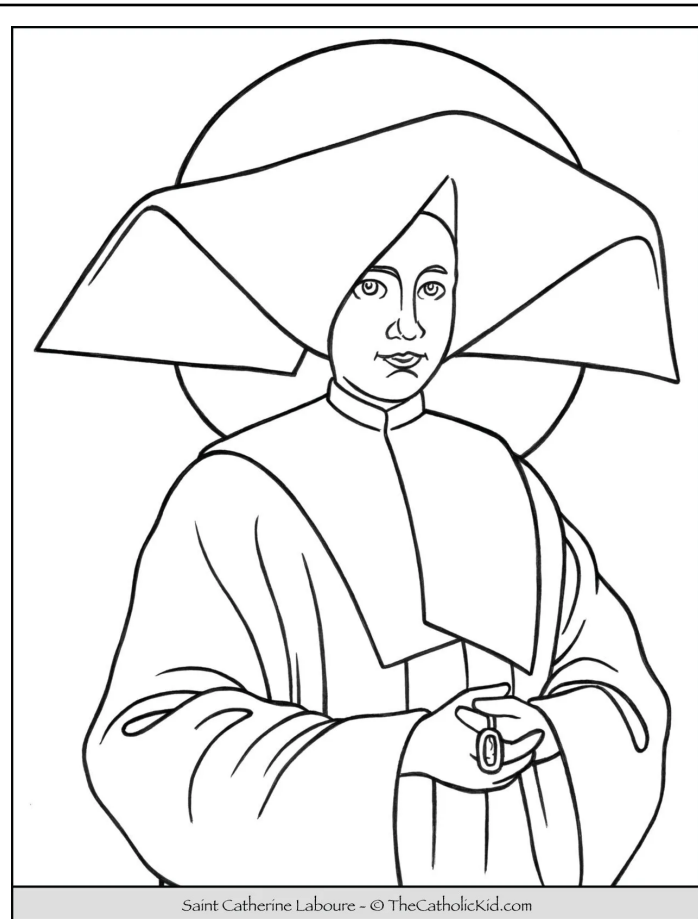
