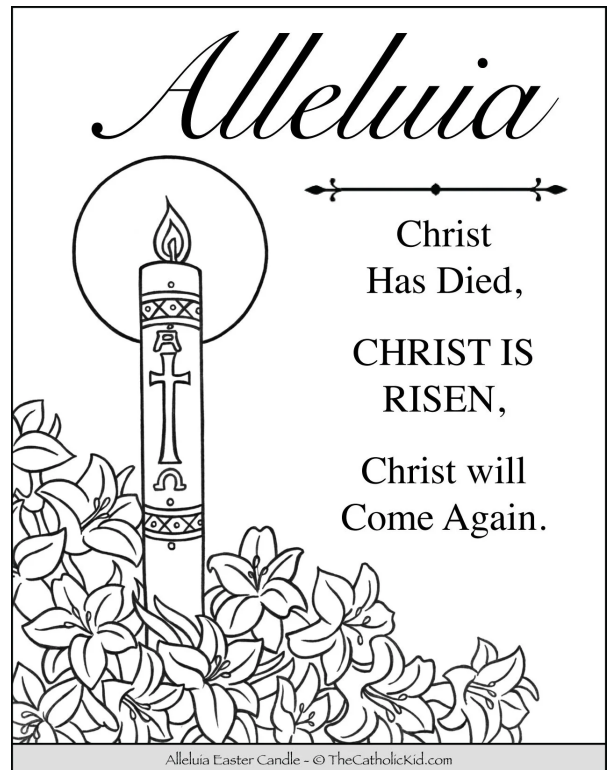

FAMILY CHALLENGE: Pray together using today's psalm, Psalm 118: "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad."

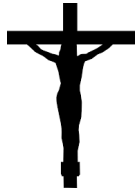

Saint of the Week

Saint Stanislaus was born in 1030 to noble parents in Krakow, Poland. He received a good education, was ordained a priest, and eventually became Bishop of Krakow. He drew anger from King Boleslaus II when Stanislaus called out Boleslaus' evil acts, injustices, and cruelties. After King Boleslaus failed to change his ways, Stanislaus excommunicated him and stopped services at the Cathedral when Boleslaus entered. King Boleslaus, enraged, had Stanislaus killed while he was saying Mass. Saint Stanislaus can be compared to saints like St. Thomas Becket and St. Thomas More who called out corruption in high places.

His feast day is April 11. St. Stanislaus, pray for us!
