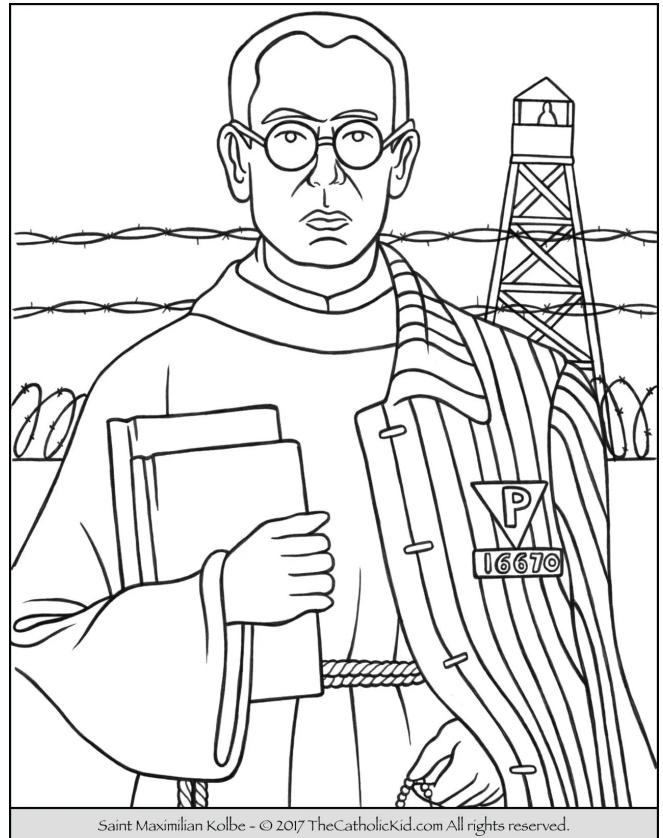

Gospel: Matthew 14:22-23

Saint Maximillian Kolbe had a vision of Our Lady when he was young. “I prayed very hard to Our Lady to tell me what would happen to me. She appeared, holding in her hands two crowns, one white, one red. She asked if I would like to have them—one was for purity, the other for martyrdom. I said, ‘I choose both.’ She smiled and disappeared.” After that he was not the same. He was ordained at 24 and spent the next years fighting religious indifference, which he thought was the deadliest poison. In 1941, he was arrested by Nazis and sent to Aushwitz. There he volunteered to take a man’s place in a starvation bunker. He died a martyr but his death was not a sudden, last-minute act of heroism. His whole life had been a preparation. His holiness was a limitless, passionate desire to convert the whole world to God. His feast day is August 14. **Saint Maximillian Kolbe, pray for us!** (Ref.: FransicanMedia.org)

wherever we are!*



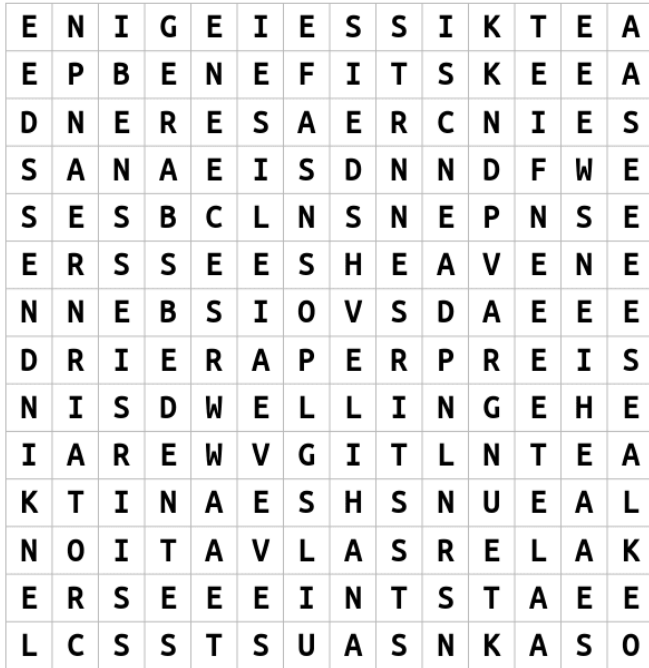
In this week’s Gospel, Jesus walks on water, and the disciples acknowledge him as the Son of God.

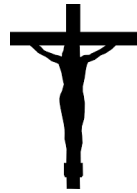
