SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION

Baptism: First-time, expectant parents must attend an instruction class prior to the Sacrament of Baptism. Call the Parish Office to make the necessary arrangements. Baptisms are usually celebrated on Sundays following the Noon Mass.

Matrimony: Registered parishioners who wish to be married at St. Ambrose, or to be prepared for marriage in another parish, must, by Diocesan policy, begin the required preparation at least six months prior to the proposed date for their marriage. Contact the Parish Office for an appointment.

Returning to the Church: If you are Catholic and returning to the Sacraments, or to the practice of the faith, we welcome you back! If you have any questions or need assistance, please contact a priest at the Parish Office or after Sunday Mass. We're happy to help you come back home to the Catholic Church.

Initiation of Adults and Children: The Rite of Christian Initiation (RCIA) is the process through which a person becomes initiated into the full sacramental life of the Catholic Church through weekly instruction. If you or someone you know would like to inquire about the life of Jesus Christ and the beliefs and teachings of His Church, please call Claire Jackson, Director of Religious Education/Youth Ministry, 703-280-1122.

Sick Calls: Contact the Parish Office to schedule visits to the sick and/or homebound for the Sacraments of Penance, the Eucharist & the Anointing of the Sick.

Parish Membership: Parish Membership is necessary for Baptism, Matrimony, or Sacramental Sponsor Forms. In order for a Sponsor Form to be issued, one must be a registered/participating member of the Parish for at least three months. Please notify the Parish Office of any changes on your registration form, telephone number, address, temporary absence, etc. Forms are available in the Parish Office and at stambroseva.org

In this week's Gospel, we see Jesus' compassionate healing of the leper. We can learn quite a lot from the leper's interaction with the Lord.

FAMILY DISCUSSION: The leper humbly says, "If you wish, you can make me clean," showing Jesus that he truly believes in the Lord's saving power but also that he must yield to the will of the Lord, not his own.

- How can we imitate this in our own prayer, asking for what we need but always humbly yielding to God's will for us?
- The leper, in his excitement, disobeys Jesus and spreads the good news of his healing, making Jesus' work much harder to accomplish.
- Sometimes we may make assumptions about what Jesus wants us to do to build up the Kingdom. However, we must remember that he has a plan! We shouldn't get in the way. How can we better listen to what he wants first, and then act or not act?
